<b>NI 16</b>	<b>Serious acquisitive crime rate</b> A countywide target but with a focus on St. Albans and Hertsmere, where the problems are most acute.	tbc
<b>NI 17</b>	<b>Perceptions of anti-social behaviour</b> Baseline will come from the forthcoming Place Survey – to be carried out in October 2008. A statistically significant increase will be negotiated by 2009.	tbc
<b>NI 32</b>	<b>Repeat incidents of domestic violence</b> Measure agreed but information not yet available - baselines and targets to be set over the coming year.	tbc
<b>NI 40</b>	<b>Number of drug users recorded as being in effective treatment</b> Baseline and target data will be reviewed when NTA revised data is released in June. Percentage increase of 5% over 3 years will remain.	tbc
